COSTS

Most students assume it is extremely expensive to study in the UK, but this is not the case! More often than not, the cost of study is cheaper than in the US. There are many reasons for this, but in general, tuition is cheaper and degree programs are shorter, and these factors together significantly reduce the cost of education.

Undergraduate degree programs in England and Wales, and Northern Ireland can be completed in just three years (in Scotland, it still takes four). This not only means that you save on time and money,

but you get to start your career or master's degree sooner!

Most Master's programs are just twelve-months of study, again, cutting your fees significantly from a two- or three-year US degree.

Tuition fees in the UK are cheaper than most private universities in the US and are on par with many public universities...

- For undergraduate degrees, you should expect to pay about \$15,000

to \$25,000 for tuition fees and around \$10,000 - \$14,000 in living costs for each year of study in the UK.*

- For graduate degrees, you are likely to pay on average around \$17,000 to \$21,000 for tuition fees and between \$12,000 to \$20,000 in living costs for each year of study in the UK.

The higher tuition costs encompass specific laboratory science programs and the MBA; the higher living costs represents the expense of living in London

ACCOMMODATION

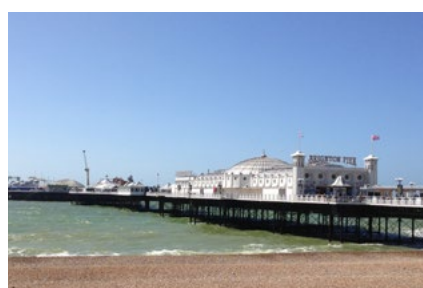
You have the choice between living in student-organized accommodation or in private housing. With benefits to each, your personal Across the Pond advisor will work with you to determine which option is best for you socially and financially.

The majority of our partner universities guarantee university-run accommodation for international students during their first year of study, which makes sorting your finances and lodging much easier from home, since you will not have to worry about any extra utility payments, taxes or fees; these are all included in one lump sum paid directly to the university.

The cost of living in UK student halls varies and depends on location, the length of your contract, and how new and modern the accommodation is. These varying factors make it difficult to provide an exact overall estimate, but most universities breakdown the cost week-by-week, with prices ranging anywhere from \$130-\$500 per week. Whatever housing option you choose, you can be confident in the knowledge that you will not be paying for any extras since electricity, water, taxes, and internet costs are all included.

If you prefer, you can choose to find private accommodation, but this can be a bit more complicated to arrange long distance, and you will be responsible for not only your rent, but also possibly city taxes and extra bills, like internet fees, depending on where you live and with whom you live. Additionally, many landlords want to meet students in person before leasing their space.

Landlords may also require large, upfront deposits, and often you will need a British guarantor and/or a British bank account. This does not mean that living in private accommodation is impossible; it is just a little bit more complicated and time-consuming to arrange. Some of our advisors have lived off-campus during their studies in the UK and are always happy to chat with you if you are considering this option, but ultimately you are responsible for your own living arrangements.

Why did you choose City, University of London?

I chose City for several reasons, first and foremost because it is located in central London. I had been dreaming about returning to London ever since I studied abroad here during my undergraduate degree. City also contains the Centre for Food Policy, which perfectly aligned with my interests and the trajectory I wanted for my future career. After seeing that the professors were leaders in their field, often speaking at conferences, to media and policymakers, I realized that my academic learning would be complemented with access to this growing network of people interested in making change in the food system. The cost of tuition was also significantly less than in the US, and the support City gives to international students made it seem like a perfect fit for me.

What is your favourite aspect of your course?

My favorite aspect of this course is the interdisciplinary nature of the modules and the projects that teach real-world skills. I also appreciate that the assignments consider tasks we will be asked to do as future policymakers or researchers. I have learned to conduct an academic literature review, to put together a governmental memo, to analyze the value chain of a food item and recognize its place within the political economy, and of course, conduct a policy analysis.

What's been the highlight of your time at City so far?

The highlight of my time at City has been the connections I've made with fellow classmates, students, academics and the community. City provides many opportunities to learn more about your chosen field or branch out and discover

something new.

How is City helping you prepare for your chosen career path?

City offers a wealth of resources to help me develop my career readiness. The Careers Service initially helped me with translating my resumé into a CV that would be taken seriously by UK-based employers, and directed me to a number of resources for finding a part-time job during my studies. They've graciously helped me look into the food and policy spheres to find the best places that I might find a full-time job after graduation, and they've kept me connected with a number of events centered on graduate schemes and internships. Most importantly, the International Student Advice Team were immensely helpful in helping me navigate the student visa application process.
